The pipe organ of the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels was commissioned from Dobson Pipe Organ Builders, Ltd., of Lake City, Iowa.

According to sources, it is the 89th largest pipe organ in North America and the 143rd largest in the world. Lynn A. Dobson, owner and president of the company, collaborated with Cathedral architect Rafael Moneo in the visual design of the organ. It needed to be to a scale that would complement the immense space of the nave and sanctuary. The top of the organ case is about eighty-five feet from the floor. "For an organ builder in America," Dobson explains, "that is almost unheard of to have this kind of height."

The massive organ, with one hundred and five stops and a total of six thousand nineteen pipes, includes vintage pipes from the organ in the Cathedral of St. Vibiana. The power of the organ causes the room to vibrate enabling the assembly to both hear and feel the music, thus making the experience all the more powerful, emotionally, as well as physically. You can experience the power and beauty of the Cathedral Organ on Wednesday afternoons at 12:45 pm when the Cathedral offers free Organ Recitals and Demonstrations.



The unique relationship between cathedrals and the arts dates back to medieval times when the cathedral served as the cultural heart of the community. The Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels upholds this tradition through its dynamic music program.

The mission of the Cathedral Music Program is twofold: to support the assembly at liturgy through sung prayer and to reach out to the greater Southern California community through non-liturgical concerts and performances. With its premier organ, multiple choirs, and wide-ranging Concert Series, the Cathedral music program strives to inspire parishioners and visitors alike.

Youth Orchestra of Los Angeles

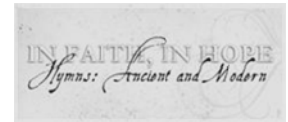
